BISHOP PRAISES PARISHES FOR RESPONSE TO MMF CALL

The New Year brought good news for the diocese's finances which received a 20 per cent boost in 2015.

In 2014 the diocese, facing a shortfall of £1.2 million, asked parishes to increase their Mission and Ministry Fund (MMF) contributions by 28 per cent, a move that many thought impossible.

While the 20 per cent increase realised in 2015 falls below that target, it is a move in the right direction and is largely down to the responses of people in the parishes who have gone above and beyond in their efforts.

Bishop Tim said: "I am incredibly humbled by the responses from the parishes. We still face a shortfall but given the 28% increase that was asked, this increase is nevertheless very encouraging and I want to thank everyone in our parishes that work so hard to maintain the mission and ministry in this diocese."

At Synod in November 2015, members were told that between 2008 and 2014, the MMF call had only increased by 3.8 per cent despite costs increasing during that period by 16 per cent. The shortfall was



filled by the diocese eating into its reserves year after year, a situation that could not continue.

In 2016, the diocese expenditure is likely to be just over £7 million, the bulk of that being the cost of ministry (£5.51 million). Other costs include Governance and support (£0.62 million) and Mission (£0.42 million).

Bishop Tim added: "There is still much hard work for all of us but I do see this response to the MMF Call as a first step in moving forward and responding appropriately in our discipleship. Generosity is part of our discipleship, our response to the call of Jesus. It is not just about giving of our money, it is about how we spend our time, our talents and our possessions."

CCF GRANT SCHEME ENDS

The Church and Community Fund (CCF) grants scheme, which has been supporting parish projects for almost a third of a century, will no longer be receiving grant applications.

Instead from 2017, the Archbishops' Council will distribute over £20 million a year to dioceses from monies made available by the Church Commissioners.

Existing grant holders will be able to draw down their grants in the usual manner and will not be affected by this decision.

MISSION CASE STUDY

VOLUNTEERS 'LIVING THE FAITH' THROUGH STOKE CLIMSLAND'S POPULAR POP-UP CAFE



A pop up café run by members of Stoke Climsland Church has gone from strength to strength since it first opened its doors 18 months ago.

Up to 60 people a week enjoy a selection of homemade cakes, quiches and sausage rolls produced by the volunteers and enjoy a steady supply of teas and coffees, all given free of charge.

The cafe came about when two ladies from a fellowship group within Stoke Climsland Church put forward the idea of a community café to priest in charge, Revd Tony Stephens. The village hall was chosen rather than the church to make it more accessible for people in the wider community.

The aim of the café is to support the community through the Christian faith. Barbara Bennett, one of the organisers of the café, said: "We don't 'pump' Christianity at all; we just live it."

Everything in the café is free of charge with donations welcome. Barbara said: "If people give us a smile or £5 it doesn't matter, people give what they can but in general people want to give."

The café runs from 9am to 12.30pm every Tuesday, all year round, with one week

attracting 75 people. On arrival people are greeted with a hand shake or hug and a listening ear. Barbara added: "People who come in regularly have said the feeling of friendliness and genuine warmth is very different to elsewhere."

Now the café is running at a profit and the volunteers plan to donate the money to charity. Barbara said: "The emphasis is on the café serving the local community and sometimes it is nice to give back to other areas of the community."

The café has also helped to grow the church with three new people joining the congregation. "Because they know a face when they come into the church it is not such a big step to make", said Barbara.

Barbara's advice to any churches thinking of running a pop up café is to do it. "It is one of the most worthwhile outreaches you can do, you're not preaching Christianity you are just living it but it is jolly hard work and you need volunteers willing to do it."

FROM THE CANON THEOLOGIAN

I have been asked to share my faith story. It begins in my early teens in the 1960s. Sex, drugs and rock-n-roll had passed me by. What didn't pass me by were the big questions that teenagers ask.

What's the meaning of it all? What's it all about?

STEPHEN DAWES CANON THEOLOGIAN

My grandparents went to chapel, but there had been no religion in my childhood. I began to wonder if Christianity might have any answers to our questions. My church-going friends were concluding that it hadn't and were leaving the church. I decided to give it a try.

I met a group of young people who were encouraged to ask questions and think things through. I joined in enthusiastically. Jesus began to intrigue me and challenge me.

Eventually I committed myself. I signed the 'Disciples' Roll' at a Methodist Sixth-Formers' Conference in a very bleak Whitby in February 1965. I thought that was enough to be going on with, but God didn't, and finally I gave in to the idea of being a Methodist minister.

Fifty years later I am still on the journey. I am still learning that God is love, and that love is the way to live. I am still being challenged to walk the way of that Galilean Rabbi. There are still ups and downs, not least because the church is not the easiest place in which to follow Jesus. There is still new thinking to be done, and the call to live and act in demanding and sometimes sacrificial ways hasn't stopped with retirement.



So, for me, maybe the key word in my Faith Story is "discipleship" - learning, following, walking in the way of God's love taught and demonstrated by Jesus. That still gives me the answers to my questions about the "meaning of life".
